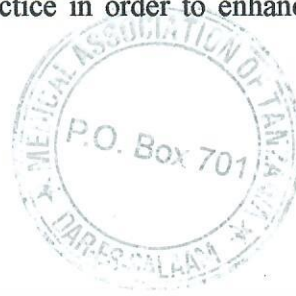
MAT is the leading and learning professional body improving quality of healthcare in Tanzania through attention to ethical, quality, evidence-based practice and continues professional development.

## ABOUT THE 53<sup>RD</sup> MAT SCIENTIFIC CONFERENCE

### • Opening session

Delegates arrival and registration started early in morning at 06:30Am. After every delegate settled in, the conference was opened officially by Dr. Deusdedit Ndilanha, President Elect of MAT where he introduces President of MAT, Patron of MAT, and Directors from Bugando Medical Centre, MOI and MNH. Also he introduces all senior doctors who attended as well all doctors from all MAT zones in Tanzania.

### • Keynote Presentations

The first Keynote speech was from Dr. Mwelecele Malecela, Director of Neglected Tropical Diseases at The World Health Organisation Headquarters. Dr. Malecela presented virtually on COVID 19 and the undeniable case for equitable health for all. She also critically discussed the challenges in implementing multisectoral collaborations in this COVID-19 era.

The second keynote speech was addressed by Prof. Kaushik Ramaiya (on behalf of Dr. Ntuli Kapologwe who did not manage to attend the conference). Prof. Kaushik's presentation titled "COVID 19 Clinical Perspective" focused on the Immunology, Preventive measures, Underlying conditions associated with severe symptoms of COVID-19, COVID-19 Impact (Patient Perspective), COVID 19 and Pregnancy, Complications associated with COVID-19, COVID-19 vaccine, Oxygen shortage mainly in Africa counties, and effects of COVID-19 on HIV, TB and Malaria treatment. Also, Prof. Kaushik cited a number of research works on COVID-19 in Tanzania notably the recent published paper by Aga Khan Hospital in Dar es Salaam.

The third keynote presentation was from Dr. Benson Kidenya, the Head of Department of Biochemistry and Molecular biology & Associate Director at the Directorate of Research and innovation at Catholic University of Health and Allied Sciences (CUHAS). Dr. Kidenya's topic was on "COVID-19 Vaccines: Hesitancy, Skepticism and Advocacy" where he spoke on Health professional's roles in understanding the science behind the approved vaccines so that we deliver proper education to the community. Furthermore he insisted everyone to understand the model and determinants of vaccine hesitancy which span from individual personal level to the community level. Dr. Kidenya advised everyone not to blame those who are not yet vaccinated instead we should encourage them. Finally, he advised the ministry of health to give clear information on the side effects of vaccines as well as everyone to properly use social media in disseminating correct information on vaccine rather than spreading misinformation which causes harm to the community.

The fourth presentation was from Dr. Jude Tarimo, a pulmonologist from Muhimbili National Hospital, who presented on "Experience in management of COVID-19 Patients at MNH: Post-COVID-19 Lungs)". Dr. Tarimo shared his experiences on behalf of Internal medicine department at MNH in caring COVID-19 patients and the disease sequelae and how to manage



them. Notably in his presentation, Dr. Tarimo advised the government through the ministry of health to initiate special COVID-19 clinics in selected hospitals to care for Post COVID-19 Patients just like how Diabetes or Sickle cell clinics operates.

The last presentation was from Tanzania Medicines and Drugs Authority that was presented by Pharm. Seth Kisenge who is a Principal Drug Inspector in the Clinical Trial & Pharmacovigilance department at TMDA. His presentation focused on "COVID-19 Vaccines: Safety and Efficiency" where he explained in detail efficacy of various COVID-19 vaccines and their safety. He also cleared Misinformation circulating in social media about vaccines effects to humans.

Keynote presentations were concluded by a panel discussion involving responding to questions from the audience. The discussion was moderated by Dr. Elisha Osati, Immediate MAT past president and Physician at Muhimbili National Hospital.

- **Professionalism Talk (Ngirwamungu Memorial Speech)**

Ngirwamungu memorial talk was delivered by Prof. Joseph Kahamba, Consultant Neurosurgeon at Muhimbili Orthopedic Institute and Past President of MAT. This year's topic was on "Gifts and bribes from patients and its impacts on professional ethics". Prof. Kahamba started by Acknowledgements to MAT council and the organizing committee for organizing the conference. Thereafter he spoke in detail on the history of Dr. Michael Ngirwamungu who was the first Tanzanian to study Public Health in Liverpool, first African Director of DSM City Health Services. Dr. Ngirwamungu died of Tension pneumothorax following road traffic accident.

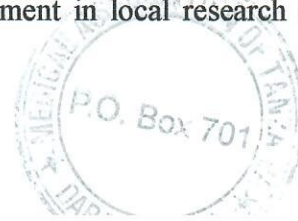
Quoting Prof. Kahamba "There is a lot of goods when patients give gifts to the doctor but on the other hands this can cloud doctors judgements. Gifts can be small or high value. Ask yourself, will you be comfortable when your colleagues see you receiving gifts from a patient?"

Prof. Kahamba insisted that Patients bribe is prohibited globally whether small or high value (Bribe is bribe).

He concluded by saying "Medicine is a noble profession thus taking bribe is illegal. It is crime on trust and misdemeanor"

MAT Patron, Prof. Lawrence Museru delivered his greetings before the audience and guest of honor citing on the journey of MAT where it came from and where it s heading. He congratulated MAT Leadership and the Organizing committee for the successful conference. Furthermore, he encouraged the discussion on the role of alternative medicines in COVID-19 management with science-based facts where he insisted investment in local research that can help in providing local solutions to various health problems.

- Award to the role model Doctor: This award was presented to Prof. Kaushik Ramaiya for his outstanding work in promoting Healthcare delivery in the country. Prof. Kaushik has more than 70 peer reviewed papers, Founder of Tanzania Diabetes Association - TDA (currently acts as Secretary General), Trained more than 4000 health care providers in Diabetes, 38 diabetes clinics have been established since TDA was founded and free consultations & diabetes supplies are being given to children and adolescents with diabetes. Also, he is one of the founders of TANCDA (Tanzania Non-Communicable Diseases Association), served as chairman of IDF in African region and prepared manuals on management of Diabetes Mellitus, Served as Vice chairman of IDF (International Diabetes Federation) for 2 years and currently he is the Board Member of World Diabetes Foundation.
- Award to Hon. Dr. Dorothy Gwajima, Minister of Health, Community Development, Gender, Elderly and Children for her tirelessly efforts in fighting against COVID-19 in the country.

- Certificate to Participants of Surgical Skills Training in Geita region at Geita Regional Referral Hospital.

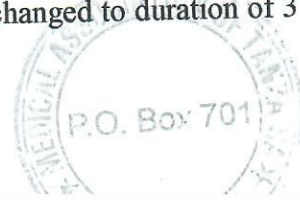
- **MAT President address to the guest of Honor**

MAT President, Dr. Shadrack Mwaibambe started by appreciating the Guest of Honor and all special invited guests for attending the 53<sup>rd</sup> conference. This was followed by introduction of high table and other special guests to the guest of honor as well as appreciating all sponsors of the conference.

He thanked the Government on health sector improvement under the leadership of H.E President Samia Suluhu Hassan.

Dr. Mwaibambe went on to speak on challenges facing MAT which are:

Lack of MAT building which was an order by his excellence late Dr John Pombe Joseph Magufuli who was president of the United Republic of Tanzania during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tanzanians doctors day held in JNCCI 20<sup>th</sup> February 2020 (this hinders carrying out some of activities of the association), Scheme of Services does not consider those with education level higher than Master s degree (Super specialists), Lack of regulatory authority in NHIF (the current authority is not neutral), MCT licencing every year should be revised and changed to duration of 3 years,





MAT is not part of ministry in the fight against COVID-19 thus hindering proper involvement of Doctors in the fight.

- **Guest of Honor Speech**

The Guest of honor, H.E Eng. Robert Gabriel, Regional Commissioner of Mwanza (Representing the minister of Health, Community Development, Gender, Elderly and Children) appreciated the invitation and encouraged MAT to engage actively on COVID-19 vaccination and advocacy as well insisting every Doctor and other health professionals to adhere to professionalism ethics as per Ngirwamungu memorial lecture.

Addressing the challenges mentioned by the MAT president's speech, The Guest of Honor quoted from the speech prepared by minister of Health Community development elderly and children and said they will organize a meeting with the Minister of Health and MAT Leaders to discuss the challenges rose. Also, he promised to make a thorough follow up and make sure MAT gets the building in fulfilment of promise made by the Late Dr. John Pombe Magufuli during Doctor's day commemoration in 2020.

He promised to follow up on the issue of scheme of services so that every practitioner benefit as per their education level as well acknowledging receiving and working on opinions regarding the issue of renewal of Doctor's practicing licences on 3 years interval.

The Guest of Honor declared that as from today MAT will be part of ministry in the fight against COVID-19.

Before concluding, He made a promise to give beach plots to Doctors who wish to live in Mwanza for a subsidized price as a special appreciation to all doctors.

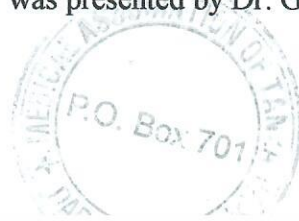

## PRESENTATION FROM MCT REGISTRAR

This was a 2 hours session which was led by the registrar of The Medical Council of Tanganyika, Dr. David Paul Mnzava. The discussion was divided in 2 parts: a thorough introduction of MCT and its work, as well as responding to various questions from the audience.

- **The work of MCT**

Dr. Mnzava started by highlighting elements of quality healthcare which are: People centered, Timely, Equitable, Integrated, Efficient and Effective. The role of MCT as regulator is to focus on ensuring quality Health workforce through training where as purpose of MCT as a regulator is to ensure professional competency at all times as a way of improving patient care.

Also, Dr. Mnzava explained in detail the types of registration that MCT offers to medical and dental practitioners which are: Provisional registration, Full registration, Limited registration.

Regarding the Process of conducting CPD, Dr. Mnzava said the council is going to work with professional associations and individual practitioners. The process will involve accrediting the providers and CPD programs. We should strive to put most of the training online with post session assessment.

- **Questions and Answers**

The following are questions and answers as they were responded by Dr. Mnzava:

Qn 1: How does MCT help Tanzanian Doctors to practice part time in other countries? How do we go about it? How do you help newly graduates who are still not employed to become among the best practitioners?

*Ans: To practice outside the country is individualized, what MCT has done is to facilitate permanent registration that allow or ease the process. For newly graduate, we believe private sectors are helping in providing employment, the only challenge existing is the difficult in regulating private facilities in the aspect of salary payment. Currently the government is working on regulating those already employed and yet not in their working areas so as to provide a chance for those not yet employed.*

Qn 2: There should be a clear statement, rules and documents on the use of MCT stamp

*Ans: The law is already there, all that remain is enforcement.*

Qn 3: CPD points should be reviewed (to add some of the aspects as part of CPD points eg number of patients a doctor serves and attendance of conferences like this one).

*Ans: This is being addressed and more than 25% of points are coming from professional associations*

Qn 4: Uniformity of training of medical doctors, concerns of pre and post intern examinations:



why not regulate curriculums such that all institutions to have same curriculum so as to have that uniformity, or have the same final university examination that will bring about the uniformity?

*Ans: Uniform curriculum has been looked into, but the challenge is the implementation of this uniform curriculum by the individual institution. Hence still making it difficult in unifying the training. The Idea of having the same final university examination is feasible and we are looking forward to implement it in near future.*

**Qn 5:** Regulations on duration from graduating to starting post graduate studies.

*Ans: This has been received as an input*

**Qn 6:** What is the role of MCT to the Medical Practitioners in Tanzania?

*Ans: To regulate and oversee and train on professionalism in medical field.*

**Qn 7:** Can MCT decentralize their offices in regions?

*Ans: Yes it is very possible. We are taking this into consideration.*

On the issue of Annual renewal of license, Dr. Mnzava concluded by saying that most of carders that do well in regulating their professionals renew their license annually, that's why MCT are adopting this as well.

## **ABOUT MAT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**

### **• Opening session**

General Secretary of MAT, Dr. Lilian Mnabwiru opened the Annual General Meeting officially by displaying the agendas and ask members of the floor if they all agree with them. All members agreed. Before commencing, 2 minutes of silence were used for a piece of prayer for all those members that passed away this year. Also, Dr. Lilian explained the reasons for not holding physical AGM for the year 2020 which is due to COVID-19 Pandemic, instead it was conducted virtually via Zoom.

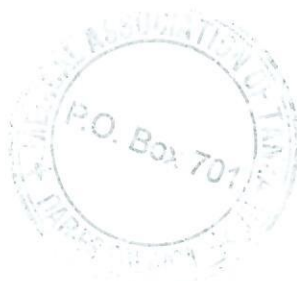

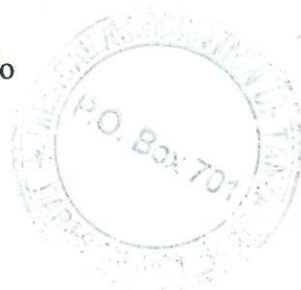

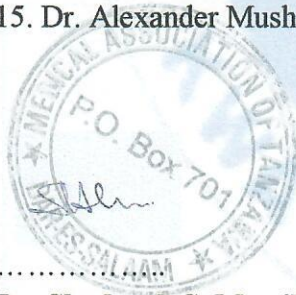
